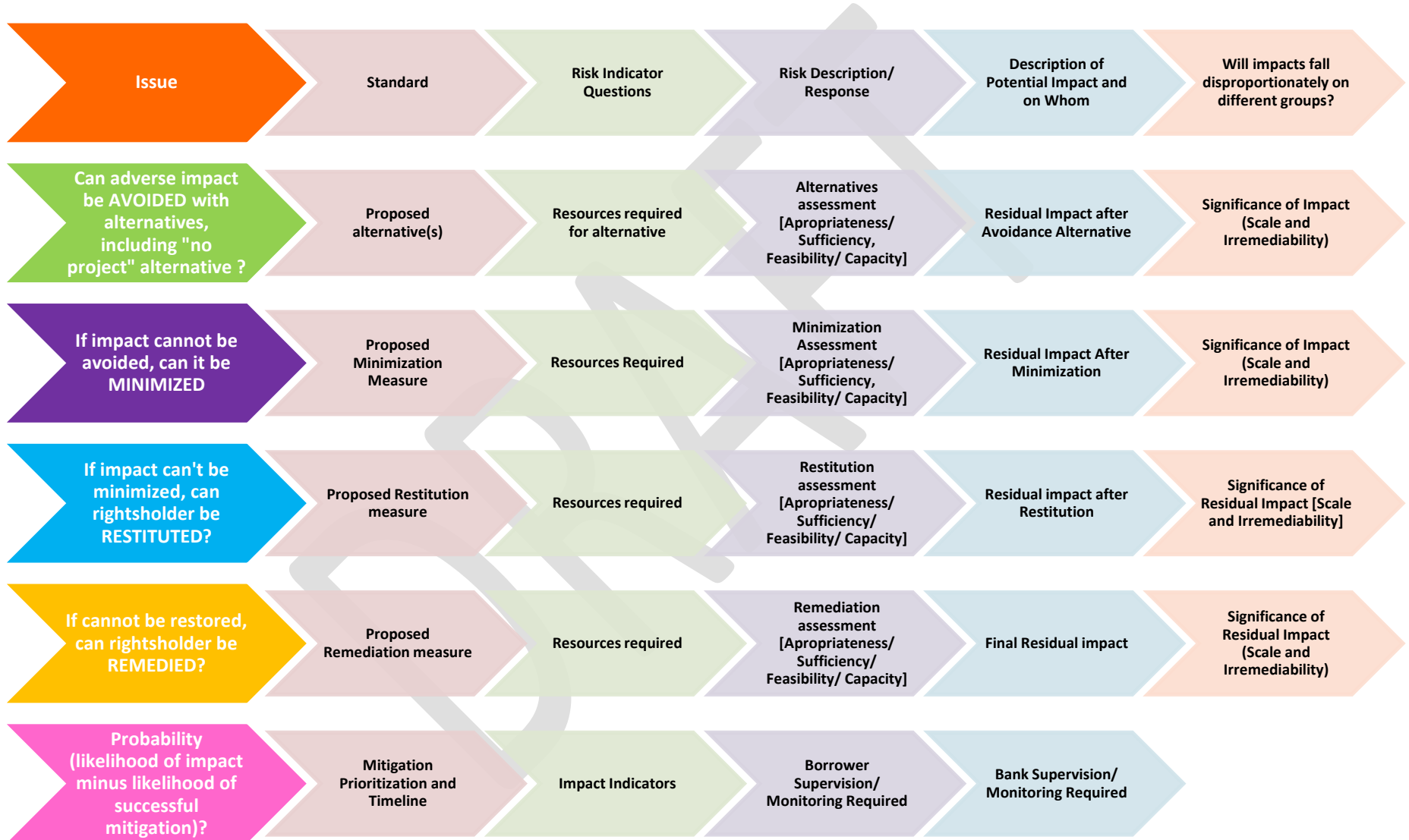

Discrimination can be direct or indirect. Direct discrimination occurs when an activity is aimed at benefiting or excluding a particular group because of a distinguishing personal charactersitic. Adequate housing meets the following conditions: Legal security of tenure (a degree of security of tenure which guarantees legal protection against forced eviction, harassment and other threats), Affordability (Personal or household financial costs associated with housing should not threaten or compromise the attainment and satisfaction of other basic needs), Habitability (provides for elements such as adequate space, protection from cold, damp, heat, rain, wind or other threats to health, structural hazards, and disease vectors), Availability of services, materials, facilities and infrastructure (including safe drinking water, adequate sanitation, energy for cooking, heating and lighting, sanitation and washing facilities, means of food storage, refuse disposal, etc.), Accessibility (taking into account the specific needs of disadvantaged and marginalized groups such as the poor, people facing discrimination; persons with disabilities, victims of natural disasters), Location (allowing access to employment options, health-care services, schools, child-care centres and other social facilities, and avoiding polluted sites or immediate proximity to pollution sources, and Cultural Adequacy (respecting and taking into account the expression of cultural identity and ways of life).</p>	<p>Will the activity involve housing, housing policy, land tenure, informal settlements, the migration or dislocation of people, or otherwise affect the availability or adequacy of land or housing?</p>		<p>Persons in the project or program area have decreased access to adequate and affordable housing.</p>	<p>Persons without formal land title?</p>
